7. Call to order—Pledge of Allegiance	
8. Agency Reports	
A. California Highway Patrol/COPS Team: Officer Burton –need to get	
residents to slow down, last month 14 traffic collisions including one	
fatal accident, compared to 23 accidents last month. On Aug. 13 a	
fatality occurred to Agua Dulce resident Lori Lindlief as she and her	
fiancé were walking on the White Fox Lane. Officer Burton described	
the accident caused by a DUI driver who was arrested. Officer Burton	
gave several safe walking tips such as walking against traffic, stay off	
the road, use the buddy system, and wear reflective clothing at night.	
Also carry a cell phone. Call CHP if you see unsafe driving: 1-800-	
835-5247. Officer Burton offered to provide safety information on	
motorcycle riding by calling 1-877-RIDE411. CHP will handle traffic	
control and safety during the upcoming AD parade. A resident brought	
up the issue of driving a horse and buggy on the streets of AD. It is important not to impede the flow of traffic and have a triangle on the	
back plus flashing lights at night.

B. Los Angeles County Sheriff's Deputy: Deputy Scott Short-there were	
9 crime reports last month including possession of drugs, furnishing	
tobacco to minors, attempted suicide, one mentally ill person, stolen	
boat and trailer from one of the storage facilities (owner lives out-of-	
state so the report of the theft was delayed). Some confusion on the	
Wagon Wheel Fire-sheriff's personnel carry out evacuations at the	
request of the Fire IC.	
C. Los Angeles Fire Dept/Community Service Rep: Stephanie English-	
she was at the IC on the Wagon Wheel Fire. The complication with	
evacuation of horses was the large number of horse trailers present	
doing volunteer evacuations. Animal Control was not requested by the IC to evacuate horses. AD gave great water support to the fire	
fighters. Countywide a high frequency of fires this year is expected.	
Fires between 300-500 acre fires quickly go up to 6000 acre fires. We	
have about six red-flag days on average per year. A CERT structure is	
going to be provided for Acton and Agua Dulce by the Fire and	
Sheriff's Departments at Shepherd of the Hills Church- Sept. 29, 6:00	
PM.	
9. 5 th District Report – Rosalind Wayman-improvement project on Escondido	
Road, not related to the Interpretive Center project. At the next TC meeting	
Sree Kumar and Gil Garcia will be here to report on the project. OVOV at	
Regional Planning on Sept. 28. On Sept. 27, the supervisors redistricting	
project will be at the Board meeting.	
 Dr. Brent Woodard (Superintendent AADUSD) – presentation regarding the progress and status of the Vasquez High School construction. The project 	
architect, Gary Christofi, was present. This is a long process (step 39 of	
about 427 steps in the design and approval) required to carry out the	
project. Highlights are: all environmental studies are complete, educational	
specifications are complete, and construction documents are complete and	
submitted to DSA as a full package. The project is designed to	
accommodate approx. 800 students. All stakeholders were consulted and	
the Acton CSDs were adhered to. Currently on schedule. The entrance will	
be on Escondido Canyon Road and the school will be elevated above the	
entrance. The students will be able to stay in their current classrooms during	
construction. After completion the existing buildings including the gym must	

be removed, and they are trying actively to sell the gym to prospective		
users. The buildings will be eco-friendly, use earth tones, and will be high-		
tech, for example the library will have very few books and students will		
access their study and reference materials via IPads. Intention is to go to a		
General Contractor for the project. Total project with state matching funds is \$27+ million. After DSA gives their approval, the project will be in line for		
approval of state matching funds. Construction time is estimated to be 18		
months once all funding is approved. The construction will not be modular		
but full stick construction. EP explained the excellent work done by Dr.		
Woodard in being able to move this project along in addition to his normal		
duties as District Superintendent.
